Higher Things 2026: "Dying Church Rising Hope"

Six high school youth attended the summer Higher Things youth conference hosted at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri in June 2026. The conference had 816 attendees from 115 churches from 28 states. The conference registration includes meals, lodging, and all conference activities.

Each day had time for:

- Worship / Prayer Offices
- Education / Catechesis
- Fun & Free Time

For Worship, we participated in 2 Divine Services (Setting 3 and Setting 1), 2 Matins Services, 2 Vespers Services, 3 Evening Prayer Services, and 3 Compline Services. Across these services, we sang over 40 different hymns out of the Lutheran Service Book. One Evening Prayer Service was held at the St. Louis Seminary chapel.

For Education, we attended 4 Plenary Sessions (1-hour Large Group Bible Study), 1 Ask-the-Pastor Panel, and 5 Breakaway sessions (45-min each) covering a variety of topics (40 different topics to choose from).

For Free Time, we participated in quest challenges, sidewalk chalk art, archery tag, inventing our own card game, and other fun activities to choose from each day.

Since we were in St. Louis, we also visited the Gateway Arch and the Concordia Historical Society museum at LCMS Headquarters. Everyone enjoyed conference, had fun, and learned a lot! It was great to be with so many other youth that appreciate confessional Lutheran liturgy, hymnody, and teaching.

Thank you to the congregation for your support of the youth. The youth will be sharing some of their reflections at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday, August 23rd (before Bible Study).

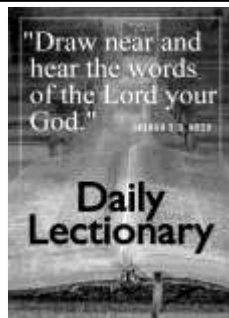
